Work with the children to allocate characters and prepare a short performance. Discuss the stage directions in advance and make sure the children understand how to follow the script.

(Topsy, Tim, and Mommy arrive at school for sports day.)

Narrator 1: Mommy came to school with Topsy and Tim. She wanted to watch the twins run.

Topsy: Tim, I can run very fast. I want to come first in all the sports day races.

Tim: You cannot come first!

Topsy: Yes, I can!



(The twins compete in the first sports day race.)

Narrator 2: In the first sports day race Topsy and Tim ran fast but they did not come first. They were not happy.

(The twins compete in the second race.)

Narrator 1: In the second race the children had to throw hoops.

Topsy: I can come first in this race.

Tim: No, you cannot! But I can!

Narrator 2: But Topsy and Tim were not good at hoops and they did not come first. The twins were not happy.

(The twins compete in the sack race.)

Narrator 1: The next race was the sack race. Topsy and Tim were not good at the sack race. They did not come first and they were not happy.

(The twins compete in the dressing-up race.)

Narrator 2: The next race was the dressing-up race. The children had to wear big coats and hats. They had to open umbrellas. Topsy and Tim liked dressing up but their umbrellas did not open. They did not come first and they were not happy.

(Topsy and Tim's mommy competes in the egg and spoon race.)

Narrator 1: The next race was the egg and spoon race. This race was only for moms. Topsy and Tim's mommy ran very fast – and she came first.

(Topsy and Tim run together with their legs tied in the next race.)

Narrator 2: Topsy and Tim had to run together for the next race. Topsy and Tim ran very fast and they came first. They were very happy.

Mommy: You came first together!

Narrator 1: She was very happy, too!
