

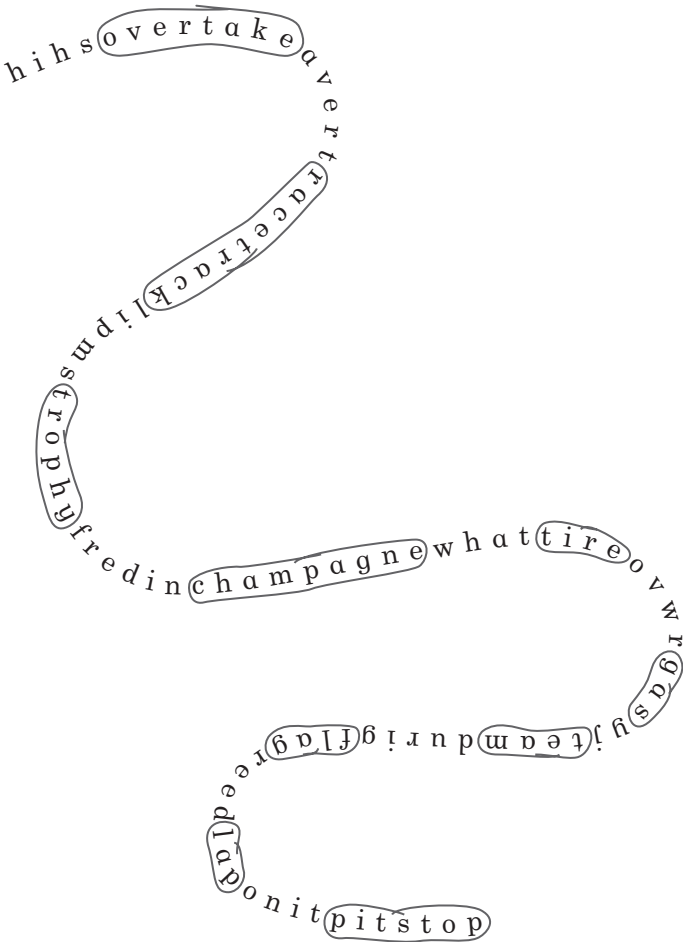

Page 49 – Activity 3

- 1 A Grand Prix race is usually 190 miles long.
- 2 It takes about two hours to drive a Grand Prix race.
- 3 Ferrari brings its team to the racetrack six days before the race.

Page 50 – Activity 4

- 1 When the drivers and engineers arrive, they go to look at the racetrack.
- 2 Most drivers have driven on it many times before, but they still need to look at it.
- 3 Before a race, the team and the drivers study the racetrack carefully.
- 4 They walk around it first, and sometimes the drivers ride bicycles around it, too.
- 5 On the Friday before the race, each team has two lots of practice time.

Page 51 – Activity 5

- 1 The practice is used to tell the team how much gas, and which **tires**, their car needs.
- 2 If there is a lot of stopping and starting in the race, then the car needs more **gas**.
- 3 The qualifying **laps** decide each driver's starting place in Sunday's Grand Prix.
- 4 If the car hits something or leaves the **racetrack**, it cannot start again!

Page 52 – Activity 6

Model answers.

- 1 When does the racing team arrive at the racetrack?
The team arrives six days before the race.
- 2 What do the drivers and engineers do before the race?
Before the race, the drivers and engineers study the racetrack very carefully.
- 3 What information do the drivers get from the practice laps?
The drivers get information about how much gas and which tires the car needs from the practice laps.
- 4 Why are the qualifying laps important to the drivers?
The qualifying laps are important to the drivers because the fastest driver will start at the front.

Page 53 – Activity 7

- 1 All the drivers want to start first in Sunday’s big race, **because** it is often very difficult to overtake after the first corner.
- 2 It is very important to drive around the corners as fast as possible, **so** all the drivers practice them.
- 3 The starting places are decided, **but** the team can still make changes.
- 4 Before Sunday’s Grand Prix begins, a green light is turned on, **and** all the drivers can do one lap.

Page 54 – Activity 8

- 1 Six days before the race, Ferrari brings its team to the **racetrack**.
- 2 There are as many as 100 people in the Ferrari racing **team**.
- 3 On the Friday before the race, each team has two lots of practice before the first qualifying **lap**.
- 4 The practice is used to tell the team how much gas and which **tires** their car needs.
