CORAL REEFS

Polyps video (Book pages 6–7)

<0:05>	Corals don't sleep at night.
<0:12>	They use their tentacles to catch food going past in the water.
<0:22>	There are many different colours and types of corals.
<0:35>	And they can grow for years and years.
<0:41>	They sometimes grow together to form reefs as big as a house!

Turtle video (Book pages 20–21)

<0:13>	Turtles love coming to this coral reef because there are lots of small fish living
	here.
<0:27>	These fish eat small animals and plants on the turtles' shells.
<0:34>	The fish get food and the turtles get cleaned.
<0:53>	There's always a line of turtles waiting by the coral reef.

Octopus and Grouper video (Book pages 24–25)

<0:06>	A grouper can't catch some of the small fish in the coral.
<0:22>	It changes colour
<0:31>	and does a headstand.
<0:44>	It is showing an octopus where the fish is.
<1:03>	The octopus puts its long arms into the coral.
<1:09>	The little fish comes out, afraid.
<1:18>	Now the grouper or the octopus can catch it.
