Golden Mole video (Book pages 10–11)

- <0:06> You don't often see a golden mole, because it lives under the sand.
<0:19> But you can see the sand moving quickly, like water.
<0:43> The golden mole has no sight, but it has very good hearing – especially under the sand.
<1:35> It puts its face under the sand and hears its prey moving above.
<1:42> When it hears the prey, it quickly comes out and catches the prey.
<2:26> People sometimes call it the shark of the dunes.

Polar Bear video (Book pages 20–21)

- <0:17> This polar bear uses its sense of smell to find a seal to eat.
<0:28> But it must get closer to the seal to catch it.
<0:33> And the seal's senses tell it when things move on the ice.
<0:45> The bear swims under the ice and looks for a hole near the seal.
<1:14> It must use its sense of sight and hearing to find the seal above the water.
<2:08> Finding the seal isn't easy!

Sea Lions video (Book pages 28–29)

- <0:08> Like many sea animals, sea lions can hear and see well above and below the water.
<0:27> Their long whiskers also help them to sense things around them.
<0:34> These young sea lions are play-fighting.
<0:47> Sea lions also use their whiskers to hunt because they feel things moving in the water.
<1:25> This young sea lion is leaving his home to go look for some tuna.
